FUSIA Communications' 17th annual Graduation and Inauguration Dinner was held at the historic Neir's Tavern in Woodhaven on July 15, celebrating the exchange interns sponsored by the group under the U.S. Department of State's Exchange Visitor Program, BridgeUSA, and community partners.

FUSIA, which stands for the fusion of the United States and Asia, said the evening's highlight was the appearance of state Assemblyman David Weprin, center in both photos, a longtime supporter and host of the program. Weprin awarded citations and certificates to the interns, recognizing their contributions to area organizations and neighborhoods. "These young people aren't just
